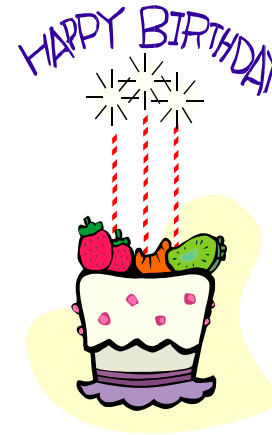

The Constitution of Moose International and the Supreme Lodge, General Laws of the Supreme Lodge, and the by-laws of Moose International shall apply to any matters which are not specifically addressed within this Code of Rules.

The principle purpose of the International Moose Legion Office, and the International Moose Legion Council, is to act as the headquarters and governing body for the system of fraternal units in the Loyal Order of Moose known as named and numbered Moose Legions.

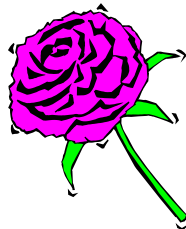
OBJECTIVES

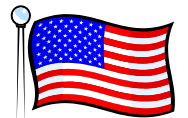

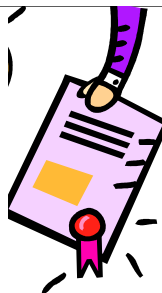

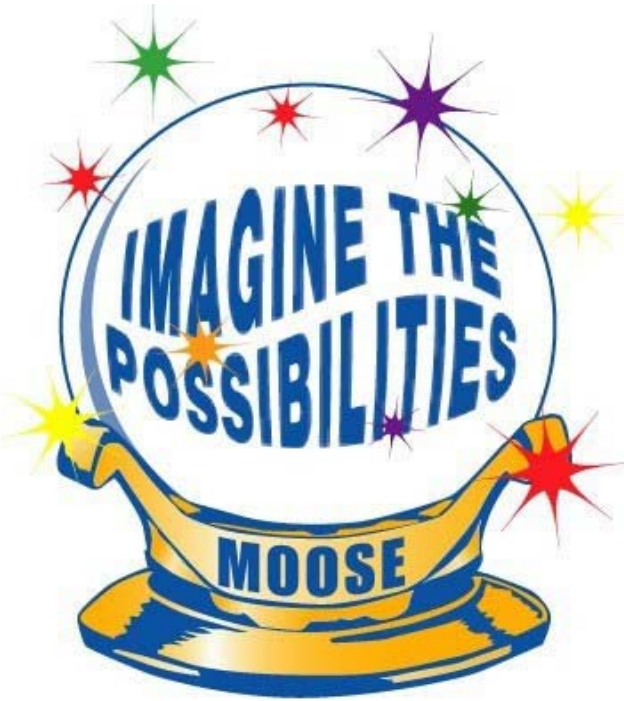
