Governor's Message for January — February 2015!!

General Laws

Sec. 33.1 - Elective Officers - The elective officers of a lodge shall consist of a Governor, Junior Governor, Prelate, Administrator, Treasurer, and three (3) Trustees who must be active members of the lodge in which they are elected. All officers,



except the Administrator and Trustees, shall serve for one (1) year. The Trustees shall be elected to a three (3) year term, providing their terms are so arranged that one (1) expires annually. No officers shall be eligible to serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in any one office, unless the General Governor issues a dispensation. Each officer shall serve until his successor is elected and installed.

Sec. 33.2 - Nominating Committee - A Nominating Committee shall consist of the eight (8) elective officers for lodges with a full Board of Officers or six (6) officers for lodges using only one (1) Trustee, five (5) Past Governors (if the lodge has so many available) in their order of juniority by service in that lodge, and five (5) members of the lodge appointed by the Governor, each of whom must be an appointed officer, committee chairman or Past Governor (honorary or by service) of that lodge. A larger Nominating Committee may be assembled when the lodge deems it necessary for the good of the lodge.

Sec. 33.3 - Meetings of Nominating Committee - The Nominating Committee shall be organized not later than the last regular general membership meeting in February for the regular election and not later than three (3) weeks prior to any special election. The committee shall give written notice of the time and place of its meeting to the Administrator of the lodge and by verbal report in an open lodge meeting.

With the exception of the Administrator, all officers shall be nominated at the last general membership meeting in March and elected at the first general membership meeting in April. Special elections shall be conducted at a general membership meeting. general membership meeting of the lodge or he may authorize the position to be filled by appointment.

Any member desiring to run for an elective office (other than the office of Administrator) in the lodge shall submit his name to the Nominating Committee at least one (1) week prior to the date the committee is required to present its report to the lodge. (Please see the complete section in the General Laws)

Strong Community Service Program Builds Awareness and Showcases Value

At various points through the year, any number of Moose members are going to have an idea for a community service project that their Lodge or Chapter can organize.

When those moments happen, the next step is to attend a Lodge or Chapter meeting and present that idea, said Moose International Director of Activities Shawn Baile.

"Under normal circumstances, a member would present his or her idea to the Board of Officers for consideration," Baile said. "Ideally, if the Board of Officers feels it's a viable idea then this is something that would be passed to the Lodge's Heart of the Community Committee." Baile said not every idea results in a community service event. However, he said receptiveness to members' suggestions is important.

"People are going to have ideas," he said. "You don't want to have your mind made up before it's presented that it's not going to work or that you don't want to hear about it. Every idea is worth being heard."

Baile said the vitality of a Lodge operation often rests on the strength of its commitment to being the "Heart of the Community."

"Having a strong Community Service program can in no way hurt your Lodge," Baile said. "If your Lodge is doing things for the community and it's visible, then it's all the more attractive to non-members." To that end, Baile said it's important to loudly proclaim the fact that the Moose is the sponsoring organization of the event when it takes place. "It can be something as simple as wearing a Moose hat or jacket or wearing Moose T- shirts for a highway cleanup," Baile said. "That's free advertising. People will then start to associate a Moose Lodge with doing good works in the community. This is how people become aware of your organization."
