

## Santa Cruz Lodge 545 Garners The International Premier Lodge Award Gold Level at Chicago!

Santa Cruz Moose Lodge 545 Members, Friends and Associates,

I would like to report out to you regarding Santa Cruz Lodge 545's imprint upon the Loyal Order of Moose 121<sup>st</sup> Annual Convention held at Chicago, Ill, from May 22-27, 2009. As 545's Community Service Chair, Bulletin Editor and Ritual Chair, I would like to start out with Community Service. Great news here, much to our surprise, 545 garnered the Premier Lodge Award for the second time in as many years. We were awarded at the Gold level. Last year we garnered the Platinum level. This award is given to those Lodges who have met 5 mandatory and 9 alternate criteria as stipulated in the program requirements in the past Moose year. This Premier Lodge Award is awarded to those lodges that exemplify a truly successful Fraternal operation. 545 was only one of eight Lodges to garner this award from the CNMA at this level. Additionally, 545 was awarded the Community Service Award, Bronze level. This award reflects the successful efforts of our Lodge members and volunteers to improve our communities and help those in need.

We did not place in the Editorial competition awards even though we entered the Lodge Newsletter, Best News Story and Best Editorial divisions. We will try again!

I am proud to report to you that 545's Ritual Team placed 4<sup>th</sup> in the last International Lodge Ritual Competition. We started down this road in 1997 when I was 545 Governor with our then Administrator Bernie Bertronis as our coach and chairman. Bernie, as some of you may remember, was a championship ritualist in his own right and I know he was proud of 545 when our names were called in that great Moose assembly of Tuesday, May 26, in Chicago. Individually—

Orator Ray Gibson did not place in the top ten, but last year at International competition in Las Vegas he was 545's highest scoring 545 ritualist garnering 6<sup>th</sup> place.

Our Jr. Governor, Perry James, placed 9<sup>th</sup>, 0.65 of a point from 1<sup>st</sup> place.

Our Sgt-At-Arms, Lonnie Moseley, placed 3<sup>rd</sup>. Our Past Governor, Brian Murtha, placed 2<sup>nd</sup>. Our Prelate, Mike Stephens, placed 1<sup>st</sup>! Our Governor, yours truly, placed 1<sup>st</sup>.

We have worked long and hard and it finally paid off. I am so proud of these Brothers,



they are all number one in my heart for their dedication and effort. Thanks to our class consisting of 545 Gov Vince Martinez and our Past Everything Pilgrim Joe Dillon! Thanks to all those who attended the International, gave us constant motivation, got to see our performance and stood by us all these years, your support will always be appreciated. And to all our



Juan is about 12 years old and has been at Mooseheart since he was 4 years old. He is a great kid in a great environment. As we said our goodbyes we asked Juan what size t-shirt he wears, and he said that he wears a large. We will have to send him one of our new Santa Cruz Moose Lodge # 545 t-shirts After attending the graduation, touring the campus, and seeing the students living quarters, and seeing how they are treated with love and respect and how well rounded they turn out scholastically and as young citizens, I came away very impressed.




