The single biggest reason why there are delays in the processing of THOUSANDS

- Your check has been cashed.
- You have not received a new dues card.

It's quite possible that you can help us tremendously to speed up the processing of your card!

Please e-mail the Moose International Helpdesk at, helpdesk@mooseintl.org. using "Payment Resolution Info" as the subject line, or fax us at 630/966-2211 with the following information:

- Your name and Moose ID Number.
- The name and Moose ID# of the person whose dues are being paid, if different from above.
- Your Fraternal Unit (Lodge/Chapter) Number.
- The check number

used to make your payment.

■ The amount of the check.

Valid To: 09/30/2006

- The date the check was cashed.
- The last four digits of the checking account number.

If the payment was for more than one member, include the above information and the individual amount of payment for each person.

The process of researching and identifying payments received without this information is extremely time consuming. In rare instances it can take several hours to resolve just one payment!

But -- having the information requested above readily available, enables our staff to resolve most of these type of payments in just a few minutes.
